Jesus alone can show us the deepest meaning of our vocation as teachers. We know that without the grace of the sacraments, daily prayer, and a rich interior life, we will never be able to teach as God calls us to teach.

Mrs. Mary Hebert was indeed a great teacher, precisely because she possessed these three qualities in the depths of her soul. Mrs. Hebert loved children, she loved learning, and most importantly, she loved Jesus.

I witnessed firsthand the difference she made in the lives of her students, including and especially my own son, Isaiah. As he transitioned from homeschooling to a new school in a new city, Mrs. Hebert gave Isaiah the gift she gave all of her students: unconditional love and consistent affirmation. She left a permanent mark on his life, as she did on all of us. It is with great hope that I pray that Mrs. Hebert's faith and joy would bring us all closer to God and to each other. Let us all join in prayer with the Hebert family for the repose of the soul of Mrs. Mary Hebert, our beloved teacher.
